KU MEMORIAL UNION

In February, a total of 1,018 people attended the SUA sponsored Adam Devine comedy performance at the Lied Center.

STUDENT MONEY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

In February, SMMS served a total of 347 students through a number of presentations, services, and activities.

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION & EDUCATION CENTER

SAPEC conducted 15 Bystander Intervention trainings during the month of February.

KU STUDENT HOUSING

KU Student Housing filled all 138 Resident Assistant, Proctor, and Foodboard Manager positions for Fall 2017.

COUNSELING & PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

CAPS had 1,082 appointments during the month of February.

STUDENT CONDUCT & COMMUNITY STANDARDS

After participating in the Spring 2017 Student Conduct Mini-Course, 100% of participants felt they had a deeper understanding of the role student conduct plays on college and university campuses.

HILLTOP CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

During February, Hilltop Child Development Center employed 62 KU students.

KU RECREATION SERVICES

A total of 2,342 people participated in KU Fit group fitness classes during the month of February.

WATKINS HEALTH SERVICES

As of February, 685 patients have used the Immediate Care Clinic serving faculty and staff since its opening.

LEGAL SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

In February, a total of 222 students scheduled appointments with Legal Services for Students.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT & LEADERSHIP CENTER

The Center for Sexuality and Gender Diversity educated a total of 347 students, faculty, and staff through a number of presentations and trainings during the month of February.
