- Apply interpersonal communication and boundary assessment skills for the establishment of consent within future sexual engagement (Interpersonal Competence)

Description of Service/Program

This interactive work shop utilizes videos, images, and role playing to help participants develop the skills needed to request and assess consent for sexual activity with their partner(s). Sex positive education is the foundation for this session and participants will be provided with information about healthy intimate and/or sexual engagement in a variety of relationships.

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Participants will gain improved ability to negotiate sexual engagement, assess when consent has been given, and learn how to respect the personal boundaries of others.

Service/Program Student Learning Outcome(s)

Students participating in SAPEC Primary Prevention Programing will be able to...

- Demonstrate an increased confidence in their ability to ask for consent for sexual activity
- Recognize the importance of asking for consent before sexual activity
- Recognize the prevalence of sexual violence as a serious campus issue
- Demonstrate an increased willingness to ask for consent before sexual activity

Project Specifics

Project Title: Consent 101 Assessment

Purpose of the project: To assess efficacy of Consent 101 at KU through assessment of learning outcomes using validated scales.

Assessment method(s): Paper Survey for immediate pre and post assessment at each training session.

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Timeline/frequency: Training are facilitated throughout the year with high concentration in the fall semester.

Population/Sample: All participating students will have the opportunity to complete the assessment. Selected populations include but are not limited to Adidas Scholars, UNIV 101 students, Options students, Housing Student Staff, Greek Life, Athletics, and student groups training request.

Special challenges to this assessment:

Students only completing pre or post assessment. Challenge addressed by requiring attendance to entire 60 minute program to receive credit, including the time provided for pre and post assessment completion.

Tracking participant training duplication through different student organizations. Challenge address by adding a “previous trainings attended” section at the top of all pre assessments.

Use to inform current practice: Current assessment will be used to ascertain if the program is effective and what areas need to be modified for use in 2018.

Plans for reporting results: Annual Report, publish report on website, and share with student and professional staff
