





#### **Academic Success**

**Academic Advising:** The Undergraduate Advising Center and the advising centers in the academic units aid all students in taking ownership of their education by providing personalized, comprehensive academic advising in a supportive environment. They do so much more than enrollment and graduation checks; your student should check in with them at least once a semester.

**University Career Center:** The time to use the UCC and the career centers in the academic units is now. The various career centers offer career planning courses, internships, and career coaching as well as the traditional services of resume reviews and career fairs.

**Tutoring Services:** Sometimes a student needs some outside-of-class assistance to master the material. The Academic Learning Center's Tutoring Services can help you achieve your academic goals. Learn about our small group and one-on-one tutoring options at **tutoring.ku.edu**.

**Writing Center:** A second set of eyes to review a paper is always a good idea. The KU Writing Center offers expert assistance through a variety of methods. Let them help you improve your written assignments. **writing.ku.edu** 

**Academic Help Rooms:** Many of the academic departments provide content specific help. Students can drop in to the Help Room to receive class material assistance. Some of the most popular Help Rooms include Math, Physics, and Language. The School of Engineering offers mock math tests open to all students.

**TRIO SES & STEM:** TRIO SES & STEM programs offer a comprehensive approach to academic success for students who meet specific criteria such as first-generation college students, students with a disability or chronic condition, and/or students with high financial need. The McNair program helps students prepare for graduate school.

**KU Honors Program:** The Honors program provides exceptional classes, advising, and enrichment opportunities to academically-talented undergraduates. Located in the Nunemaker Center on Daisy Hill, application to the program is competitive and open to all KU students.



#### **Student Wellbeing**

#### Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS):

CAPS is the primary mental health service for students. CAPS provides group/individual counseling, crisis intervention, prevention/consultation services, and psychological/psychiatric evaluations. The staff includes psychologists, psychiatric providers, professional counselors, social workers, graduate trainees, and peer educators. The price per visit is less than \$16.

**Gender-Based Violence:** Gender-Based Violence or Interpersonal violence is a serious community health issue. KU does not tolerate acts of sexual assault, stalking, harassment, or intimate partner violence and has a variety of resources available to survivors. # **Health Education Resource Office (HERO):** HERO offers a variety of healthy lifestyle programming including smoking cessation, nutrition, and responsible alcohol use. **hero.ku.edu**

**Legal Services for Students (LSS):** LSS provides students with free and confidential legal advice as well as advocacy, preventative education, and representation from licensed, experienced attorneys. LSS is funded by the required campus fees. Visit **Legalservices.ku.edu** for more information and to make an appointment.

**KU Recreation Services:** KU Recreation Services provides a variety of resources for physical fitness including team/individual sports, classes, and personal training. Indoor and outdoor facilities accommodate a broad range of athleticism—from beginners, looking to improve their health with low impact exercise, to seasoned athletes, aspiring to push their physical abilities to the next level.

#### Student Support and Case Management (SSCM):

SSCM provides individual support to connect students to each other and their communities to create a safer, healthier, and more caring environment. SSCM empowers students to address and overcome barriers in order to achieve their educational and life goals. #### **Money Matters**

**Financial Aid and Scholarships:** Over half of KU students receive some type of aid and it is coordinated through Financial Aid and Scholarships. Their staff can assist in finding aid as well as explaining your aid package. The FAFSA form is administered through FAS.

**Student Money Management Services:** SMMS helps students understand their finances beyond budgeting. They empower students to analyze their finances, make sound decisions, and commit to controlling their financial lives. They will even complete a salary evaluation when you get a job offer.

**Student Accounts and Receivables:** You pay your bill with Student Accounts and Receivables located in Carruth-O'Leary Hall. You can pay online or in person. KU does not send paper bills; we send an email to the student. You might ask your student for Delegate Access if you are paying the bill.

**Student Jobs:** The University Career Center coordinates on campus jobs and all student jobs are listed at **jobs.ku.edu**. Having an on campus job builds a student's network of support in addition to providing income.

**Beak 'Em Bucks:** A Beak 'Em Bucks™ account is automatically set up as a declining cash balance on each KU Card. The only thing you need to do is deposit money into the account. It can be used on campus for photocopying, printing, and food purchases, as well as at the KU Bookstore. It can also be used at some off-campus merchant locations and for pizza delivery.

#### **Celebrating Diversity**

Office of Multicultural Affairs (OMA): Offering diversity and social justice education programs that foster inclusive learning environments for the campus community, the OMA is located in the Sabatini Multicultural Resource Center.

Center for Sexuality and Gender Diversity (SGD): SGD works to build community between queer and trans students, faculty, and staff and provide a wealth of information about LGBTQ+ identities for the broader KU community. The dynamic lounge space is a great place for students to meet up or check out any of the resources housed in the Center library.

#### **Emily Taylor Center for Women and Gender Equity:**

The Emily Taylor Center for Women & Gender Equity supports the personal, educational, and professional success of students through challenging patriarchal norms and raising awareness around inequity.

**Study Abroad and Global Engagement (SAGE):** SAGE offers high quality, credit-bearing education abroad programs. Almost 30% of all KU student participate in a study abroad program, some for a short as a week while others are a semester long. It is a resource for students, parents, alumni, and partner institutions providing helpful information on study abroad programs, international political/social conditions, health/safety factors, and emergency management.

Military Affiliated Student Center (MASC): The MASC serves as a centralized resource for those with a military affiliation, including those who have served, their family members, and anyone who supports them. They provide extensive support services, work with other campus offices to coordinate benefits and accommodations, and house a variety of amenities in the center.

#### **Involvement**


Student Involvement and Leadership Center:
Home to over 500 student organizations, SILC provides leadership and engagement programs.
They are located on the 4th floor of the Kansas Union in room 400. Visit rockchalkcentral.ku.edu to explore student organizations.

**Sorority and Fraternity Life:** Home to over 4,100 student members, social fraternities and sororities are governed by four councils: Interfraternity Council (IFC), Multicultural Greek Council (MGC), National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC), and Panhellenic Association (PHA). Center for Service Learning: This office connects academic learning with real life experience. The Center promotes public service, community and civic engagement by offering civic engagement, community-engaged scholarship, and other community-engaged efforts.

**Student Union Activities (SUA):** SUA hosts nearly 200 campus events, with over 40,000 attendees. The student-run board, composed of six committees, plans and carries out a diverse calendar of events including bringing concerts and comedians to campus, coordinating culinary and arts celebrations, and hosting gaming and technology experiences. SUA has something for everyone! **suaevents.ku.edu**.

**KJHK 90.7 FM:** An award-winning, student-run radio station, KJHK engages students as DJs, on-air personalities, and/or members of the following staffs: Arts & Culture, Content, Live Music, Music, Production, Sports, and Street Team. Each semester over 150 KU students help keep the station on the air.



Center for Undergraduate Research: Not all involvement opportunities are outside the classroom, students are encouraged to participate in research. Participating in undergraduate research is a great way to enhance the KU education while contributing to a field and developing professional opportunities. This office can help connect you to dozens of research opportunities.

Center for Community Outreach (CCO): CCO is a student run clearinghouse and provider of volunteer opportunities on campus and in the community. Programs include mentoring young musicians, reading to local elementary classrooms as well as volunteering the community nonprofits. Annually, KU students give over a quarter of million dollars in services to the Douglas County community.

#### **Student Technology**

**KU Information Technology:** KU IT develops, maintains and supports academic and other technology services for students, faculty and staff at the University of Kansas. Services include:

**Tech Support:** Tech Help is available by phone at **785-864-8080**, by email at **itcsc@ku.edu**, in person at Anschutz Library (room 201) and online at **technology.ku.edu**.

**Social Media:** Students and parents can keep up with technology news and alerts at KU by following **@kutechnology** on Twitter, Instagram and Facebook.

**Software:** KU Information Technology provides free and discounted software available in computer labs, through Virtual Lab (**rockcha.lk/virtual-lab**) and for use on personal computers. Students can download Microsoft Office for free by visiting **rockcha.lk/microsoft-office**.

**Computer Lab and Printing:** Computer labs in libraries and other campus locations provide students with convenient access to workstations, software and printers. Campus lab locations are listed at **rockcha.lk/computer-labs**.

**KU Tech Shop:** Part of the KU Bookstore, the Tech Shop sells Apple and Dell computers plus an array of calculators, headphones, and other accessories. They are Apple-certified technicians.

**KU Bookstore:** Located in the Kansas Union, the KU Bookstore is the official bookstore for campus. They sell and rent textbooks, have a printing service, tech shop, school supplies, and KU clothes and accessories. **www.kubookstore.com**

#### **Dining and Entertainment**

**KU Dining:** With over 16 locations on campus, good food and a great cup of coffee are never far away. Students may use their KU Dining Plan, the Grubhub app, cash, credit, or Beak 'Em Bucks™ at all campus locations. Students with a Flex plan can use the Grubhub app off campus as well.

Lied Center of Kansas: The Lied Center is the premier performance auditorium on campus. Each year, it hosts KU music and dance performances as well as national touring companies. Students are part of the stage hand teams at the Lied as well as working in the ticket office.

Fine Arts: The fine arts of dance, music, theatre, film, and the visual arts thrive at KU. There are galleries across campus to display student work. Murphy Hall is home to both a theatre and recital hall.

KU Athletics: KU is home to many national champion intercollegiate sports teams. Students can support the teams by purchasing an All Sports Combo Pass which allows access to football and men's basketball games. Students receive free admission with a valid KU Card (KUID) to soccer, some volleyball, women's basketball, baseball, softball, and the Kansas Relays. Admission to cross country, swimming, golf, track and field, tennis, and swimming and diving events is free to all fans.

#### **Booth Hall of Athletics and DeBruce Center:**

Located in Allen Field House, the Hall honors KU's historic athletics programs and its coaches and student-athletes, past and present. There are several interactive exhibits, a basketball championship trophy case, as well as the other championship trophy cases. Attached to Allen Field House the DeBruce Center houses Naismith's original Rules of Basketball as well as a food service area.



#### **Leaving Lawrence**

**Moving Out:** Whether moving out of a KU housing facility or a local apartment, the city of Lawrence offers tips to make the transition smoother.

- Usable items such as televisions, furniture, appliances, clothing: donate to local charities.
- Books, CDs, records, videos, tapes in good condition: donate to the Friends of the Lawrence Public Library, call **785-843-3833**.
- Bicycles: donate to the City Street Maintenance, call **785-832-3031**.
- Bulky items that are no longer usable, such as couches, appliances, and automobile tires: call Solid Waste for pickup at **785-832-3032**.

**Diplomas:** Diplomas are distributed by the Registrar's Office about two months after the end of a semester. Order your diploma online. It's free if it is picked up.

**Transcripts:** Official transcripts are ordered online from the Registrar's Office. The fees depend on the type of transcript (paper or electronic) and the delivery method.

**KU Alumni Association:** The Alumni Association gives you a year membership upon graduation, but don't wait to learn more about all their services. They provide a Student Alumni Network that has events as well as the Jayhawk Career Network. The Jayhawk Career Network gives students and alumni access to career resources, jobs, events, programming, and connections at every stage of their career.






#### **Other Student Services**

**Campus Cupboard:** The Campus Cupboard is the KU Food Pantry located on the 4th floor of the Kansas Union. There is no charge to use the pantry. The Cupboard is a great place to volunteer and welcomes donations.

Finals Survival Kits: Each semester, KU Endowment Association (KUEA) sells Finals Survival Kits to parents. The kit is filled with snacks, goodies, and KU swag with proceeds from the sales used to support the Campus Cupboard and student emergency finding needs.

**Delegate Access:** Your student may grant you access to some of their education records as well as their financial account at KU. Some of the information the student can give you access to include their schedule, grades, financials, and financial aid.

**Recycling/Sustainability:** The Center for Sustainability runs the campus recycling program. KU recycles Paper, Cardboard, Plastics #1-7, with the exception of Styrofoam, aluminum, tin and steel cans, Glass bottles and jars. The dining services compost their leftover food waste, too.

Office of Fellowships: The Office of Fellowships guides students through the process of applying for national scholarships and other competitive awards. A resource for students and faculty across campus, we strive to advance students as scholars, professionals, and individuals.
