

Student Affairs is committed to engaging the KU community in services and programs that make learning possible. The information presented below highlights our work for April 2019.

WATKINS HEALTH SERVICES

Based on Patient Satisfaction Survey responses, 90% of respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with their most recent WHS visit.

KU STUDENT HOUSING

A total of 134 students applied to serve as undergraduate staff members for summer 2019, an increase of more than 11% from last year.

COUNSELING & PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

CAPS conducted a total of 149 initial assessments, an increase of more than 61% from April 2018.

STUDENT MONEY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

SMMS staff assisted a total of 29 students through individual appointments, an increase of more than 81% from April 2018.

HILLTOP CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Hilltop had a total enrollment of 305 children, an increase of more than 5% from April 2018.

STUDENT CONDUCT AND COMMUNITY STANDARDS

In April, there were a total of 137 conduct-related incidents reported, an increase of more than 16% from April 2018.

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION & EDUCATION CENTER

SAPEC hosted a total of 27 events during Sexual Assault Awareness Month, compared to 31 in 2018.

KU MEMORIAL UNION

Live@KJHK, KJHK's live in-studio YouTube channel, reached 2,000 subscribers in April, an increase of more than 58% from last year.

KU RECREATION SERVICES

KU Recreation Services hosted its second Inclusive Recreation Extravaganza Event, with 100 students in attendance to observe Special Olympian Powerlifter Brady Tanner deadlift 430lbs. for three reps.

LEGAL SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

As of April, a total of 1,028 individuals participated in LSS tax workshops, a 3% increase from 2018.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT & LEADERSHIP CENTER

In April, the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) welcomed 13 new sorority and fraternity members, increasing council membership by more than 35%.

AWARDS & RECOGNITION

Aftan Jameson (Watkins Health Services) was named chair of LiveWell Douglas County's Tobacco-Free Living Group.

The **Sexual Assault Prevention & Education Center's** "What Were You Wearing?" Survivor Art Installation has been requested or displayed by over 500 organizations across six continents.

Student Affairs hosted its first installment of *Student Affairs Shares*, a webinar sharing campus information and resources with parents and family of KU students. April's installment highlighted available student mental health support services and resources.
