

Student Affairs is committed to engaging the KU community in services and programs that make learning possible. The information presented below highlights our work for December 2018 and January 2019.

WATKINS HEALTH SERVICES

Watkins assisted a total of 103 new international students, an increase of more than 17% from December 2017 and January 2018.

KU STUDENT HOUSING

After participating in training, 97% of undergraduate staff felt confident in providing mental health resources and support to residents as needed.

KU RECREATION SERVICES

In January, KU Recreation Services held its first Unified Basketball scrimmage with 19 Special Olympics Kansas athletes and 19 KU student participants.

COUNSELING & PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

CAPS assisted a total of 904 students, an increase of more than 18% compared to this time last year.

STUDENT MONEY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

SMMS staff assisted a total of 32 students in December, an increase of more than 52% from December 2017.

LEGAL SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

LSS has scheduled 37 income tax workshops through April to assist students, an increase of more than 5% from last year.

KU MEMORIAL UNION

In fall 2018, Student Union Activities (SUA) events garnered a total of 29,624 attendees, an increase of more than 23% from fall 2017.

STUDENT CONDUCT AND COMMUNITY STANDARDS

After participating in SCCS' Hazing Investigation Refresher Training, 79% of staff participants strongly agreed that they understood the current hazing behaviors at KU.

HILLTOP CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Hilltop Child Development Center had a total enrollment of 306 children, an increase of more than 4% compared to this time last year.

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION & EDUCATION CENTER

SAPEC facilitated or participated in a total of 27 trainings and/or events, an increase of 8% from December 2017 and January 2018.

OFFICE OF THE VICE PROVOST

In fall 2018, Student Affairs received 290 care reports from faculty, staff, students, and community members seeking assistance for students experiencing difficulties, an increase of more than 104% from fall 2017.
