

Student Affairs is committed to engaging the KU community in services and programs that make learning possible. The information presented below highlights our work for May 2018.

STUDENT MONEY MANAGEMENT SERVICES

In May, SMMS staff met with a total of 48 students through individual appointments, an increase of more than 269% from the previous year.

KU STUDENT HOUSING

Based on spring 2018 Skyfactor survey results, 72% of students would recommend new students live in on-campus housing, an increase of more than 8% from last year.

HILLTOP CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

In May, 82% of students working as Teacher's Aides indicated their organizational and time management skills improved as a result of working at Hilltop.

STUDENT CONDUCT & COMMUNITY STANDARDS

During the 2017-2018 academic year, SCCS provided 97 hours of training to hearing officers and hearing panels, an increase of more than 49% from the previous year.

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION & EDUCATION CENTER

As of May, SAPEC made in-person contact with a total of 23,823 KU students, faculty, staff and community members, an increase of more than 12% from May 2017.

COUNSELING & PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

In May, CAPS had a total of 120 psychiatric visits, an increase of more than 73% from May 2017.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT & LEADERSHIP CENTER

During the 2017-2018 academic year, a total of 365 students participated in leadership programs, an increase of more than 44% from the previous year.

LEGAL SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

During the 2017-2018 academic year, LSS prepared or assisted with 1,979 tax returns, an 8% increase from the previous year.

KU MEMORIAL UNION

During the 2017-2018 academic year, KU Memorial Union's website had a total of 288,834 visitors, an increase of more than 89% from the previous year.

WATKINS HEALTH SERVICES

After interacting with therapy dogs at WHS's Animal Therapy Events, 93% of students reported feeling more relaxed.

KU RECREATION SERVICES

During the 2017-2018 academic year, KU Recreation Services held a total of 65 Sport Club home events, an increase of 16% from the previous year.
