Description of Service/Program

The Freshman Leadership Connection (FLC) is a unique opportunity for first year KU undergraduate students to get involved on campus and learn the basics of leadership in an exciting and innovative way. Over 10 weeks in the fall semester, FLC participants will engage in a series of leadership workshops that revolve around small and large group discussions, team building activities, and campus/community engagement. Topics covered include group dynamics, diversity, leadership theory and practice, ethics and values, conflict management, and the development of your leadership identity.

Students participating in KU LEAD will be able to...

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1. Identify the concept of leadership as a process to effect positive change (SILC Learning Outcome # 4)
2. Demonstrate leadership skills (such as conflict resolution, ethical reasoning, team building, effective delegating, time management, effective communication, and strategic planning) (SILC Learning Outcome # 2 and # 4)
3. Develop a sense of self-awareness through identifying personal values and identities (SILC Learning Outcome # 5 and # 6)
4. Demonstrate an ability to collaborate and communicate across differences (SILC Learning Outcome # 4 and # 6)
5. Apply critical thinking skills and abilities to lead others toward common goals (SILC Learning Outcome # 1)
